MARY BRASSIL is **Partner and Head of the Employment Group, McCann FitzGerald**. He also serves on the ICTU Executive Council. Éamonn began his career as a clerical officer in Dublin Corporation, becoming active in the union before joining IMPACT as an industrial relations officer in 1999. Following Fórsa's formation in 2018, Éamonn was head of the union's Health & Welfare division, where his team worked closely with the HSE and the Department of Health throughout the Covid-19 pandemic. A lifelong and ardent fan of Arsenal, Dublin GAA, and The Who, he also performs regularly with his band, *The Rods & Mockers*.

MEG DUNPHY is **HR Policy and Engagement Manager at CIPD Ireland**. JOHN KING is **SIPTU General Secretary (designate)**. Elected Deputy General Secretary (DGS) of SIPTU for Public Service in 2017, Mr King will take up the General Secretary role in 2026. He was SIPTU's senior negotiator on the Irish Congress of Trade Unions Public Service Committee, which negotiated two Building Momentum Public Service Agreements 2020-2023 and the current Public Service Agreement 2024-2026. He has 37 years' service with SIPTU with extensive experience representing the interests of members across the private, public, and community sectors in both the Republic and Northern Ireland.

DAVID McCAULEY is **Senior Associate, McCann FitzGerald Employment, Pensions and Incentives Group**. David advises private and public sector clients on both contentious and non-contentious aspects of employment law, with extensive experience advising clients before the WRC, Labour Court and Superior Courts, as well as through mediation. David regularly advises on complex employment investigations, processes and disputes, in particular in the area of protected disclosures, as well as corporate restructurings, business transfers, outsourcing and redundancy situations. Professor Ó Beacháin is the author of several books, including his most recent work, *Unfinished Empire: Russian Imperialism in Ukraine and the Near Abroad* (2025).

PAULINE O'HARE is **Senior Legal Director at Ibec**. Pauline O'Hare is a graduate of UCD, where she obtained a Bachelor of Civil Laws degree and a Masters in Commercial Law, before qualifying as a solicitor in February 2006. Pauline previously worked in private practice before joining Ibec's Employment Law Services team in 2008. Pauline specialises in employment law and industrial relations and engages with key stakeholders on policy matters at both a national and EU level and was a member of the technical working group for the Action Plan on Collective Bargaining.

EMILY O'REILLY is **former European Ombudsman**. Emily is an author and former journalist and broadcaster and has served in key public positions in Ireland and Europe over the last two decades. Emily became Ireland's first female Ombudsman and Information

Commissioner in 2003. She was voted European Ombudsman by the European Parliament in 2013 and served two terms, to 2024. She was educated at University College Dublin, Trinity College Dublin, and Harvard University, where she was awarded a Nieman Fellowship in journalism, and has worked at RTÉ and Today FM.

EMILY HARNETT has been the **Head of Marketing at Codex** since 2019. In 2025, she led the company's neuroinclusion initiative, including research, partnership with AsIAm and product launch of Thrive collection. Her approach centres on practical change—policy, leadership behaviours, and everyday workplace design—grounded in empathy and collaboration. As a speaker, Emily is known for her honest, thoughtful perspective and her ability to connect strategy with real human impact. She speaks passionately about neuroinclusion, inclusive leadership, and the role organisations play in building workplaces where everyone can do their best work.

Dr VALENTINA PAOLUCCI is a **Lecturer at Maynooth University School of Business**, specialising in employment relations, trade union revitalisation, and labour market regulation. Her research examines how collective bargaining and institutional frameworks shape working conditions, with particular focus on flexibility, precarious work, and pay coordination across Europe. She has conducted multi-level comparative analyses in Ireland, Italy, Denmark, and the UK. She currently leads the EuCoBarg consortium for Eurofound's EU-wide project "Promoting collective bargaining – lessons from the past and the determinants of collective bargaining coverage" and also serves as an External Expert for Eurofound.

LYNN RHINEHART is **Senior Fellow at the Economic Policy Institute**, a Washington, D.C.-based think tank. Lynn is a Washington, D.C.-based labor lawyer and labor policy expert. Lynn served as Senior Counselor to U.S. Secretary of Labor Marty Walsh and Acting Secretary Julie Su on issues relating to unions and collective bargaining during the Biden Administration. Until July 2018, Lynn was General Counsel of the national AFL-CIO, a federation of 64 national and international labor unions representing 15 million working people. She is a Senior Fellow at the Economic Policy Institute, a Washington, D.C.-based think tank.

RICK WARTERS is retired, now **researching and writing on history and labour relations**. Rick joined United Technologies Corp. [UTC] after graduating from Cornell University, USA. Over the next 35 years, he negotiated successful labour outcomes in the aerospace, automotive, and building systems industries during decades defined by intense globalization. Rick spent the last nine years of his corporate career leading global employee and labor relations for UTC's 240,000 employees at Pratt & Whitney, Collins Aerospace, Carrier, and Otis.
