I am writing to you today to ask you to look at IMPACT's online <u>General Election Guide</u> ahead of the upcoming election.

On February 26<sup>th</sup> we have an opportunity and an obligation, I feel, to vote in a way that will inevitably shape our future terms and conditions, as well as our capacity to deliver excellent public services.

Emerging from a crisis caused by greed, corruption and lack of proper regulation, our society faces huge choices about job creation, health, housing, education and other public services.

It's crucial to remember we have choices now in a way that has not existed for eight years.

As a union we stand together, unashamedly, on the side of efficient, organised and well-funded public services.

As voting members we must make choices too.
